Mayor Brown called the regular meeting of the City Council to order. Present were Council Ashworth, Wahrer, Clerk Blevins, Administrator White and Attorney Phillips with Hazlett, and Zoellner, being absent.

Minutes of the April 4, 2012 meeting were approved as written.

**CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:**

Administrator White stated House Bill 12-1280 for VLT's is before the Finance Committee at this time. The language has been changed to state this will be for one location on the western slope. Public Works Director Greg Severance has been working on applying for an Enhancement Transportation Grant for Teller County Road #1. If granted the funds would be disbursed in 2013 for much needed assistance in correcting the sharp curve on Teller 1 where there have been many accidents and even deaths. Ray asked Mayor Brown to sign a letter of intent to be sent to CDOT for the matching funds in 2013 budget. The Spring Clean Up days are May 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> from 9am-3pm.

**FINANCE DIRECTOR REPORT:**

Finance Director Harris stated the March gaming numbers are in and the City of Cripple Creek is still up 1.8%.

**PLANNING & HISTORIC PRESERVATION REPORT:**

Development Director Manning stated the Dollar Store is still moving forward. Big Jim's is moving forward with plans to expand. The Gold Rush is moving forward. The Development Code is available for public review and comment.

**PRESENTATION OF CCVHS EPYCS CLUB RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COMMUNITY ALLOCATION GRANTS; JEFF BARKLEY**

Andy Frank representing the Cripple Creek-Victor High School EPYCS Club read the following recommendations for the Spring Community Allocation Grants: 1) \$2,500 to Teller County Search and Rescue 2) \$1,500 to the Cripple Creek School Ski Club 3) \$2,500 to Community of Caring 4) \$2,000 to the Resource Exchange 5) \$2,000 to CHOICES 6) \$2,000 to Cripple Creek High School James Conaster Memorial Scholarship Fund, for a grand total of \$12,500. In addition EPYCS is also awarding two grants of \$1500 one to CASA and one to the Victor Ag and Mining Museum. Funds for these grants are provided by the El Pomar Foundation. There was no public comment. Ashworth made a motion to approve the recommendations from EPYCS. Wahrer second and motion carried.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TO ESTABLISH EXPANDED TRANSIT SERVICE; RAY WHITE**

Administrator White stated this is an MOU between the City of Cripple Creek, the City of Victor and Community of Caring regarding the improvement and expansion of transit service in Southern Teller County, Colorado. Rick Langenberg asked when this project will begin and what the cost would be. This is simply an MOU stating that the City of Cripple Creek, the City of Victor and Community of Caring are committed to this project and willing to explore grant funding. Ashworth made a motion to approve the MOU between the City of Cripple Creek, the City of Victor and Community of Caring. Wahrer second and motion carried.
