

11/17/2021 COVID-19 Update (data is as of 11/16/21).

Summary: In the first sixteen days of November, Teller County has recorded 228 new cases. The spread appears to be picking up a bit and deaths continue to occur. Unfortunately, seven people in Teller County have died from COVID in November. Of the 39 total deaths in Teller County, since the Pandemic began, 30 deaths, or 77%, have occurred in 2021.

Under the new CDC level of community transmission (Low, Moderate, Substantial, High) Teller County is rated High (RED) today, which it has been for the past eleven plus weeks.

- **Cripple Creek:** No new data for Cripple Creek.
- **Teller County:** Teller County has added 228 new cases in November. Recent new case count by month: October 459, September 339, August 115, July 73, June 91, May 179, April 232 and March 150. CDPHE's COVID-19 total case count for Teller County as of yesterday was 3,040.
- Teller County is reporting that, as of last week, 56.9% of the eligible population is full vaccinated.

Overall Teller County Status:

- **One Week Cumulative Incident Rate:** Current figure is 387.5, which is worse than last week's figure of 286.6.
- **Two Week Cumulative Incident Rate:** Current figure is 661.9 which is better than last week's figure of 682.1. Anything over 100 is considered condition YELLOW, 175 - 300 is ORANGE (High Risk), and over 300 is RED on the old State Dial.
- **One Week Positivity Rate:** Current figure is 11.8%, which is worse than last week's figure of 10.6%. The goal is under 5%.
- **Hospitalization Rate:** No new data.
